Preface

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee JT-001, Strategic Advisory Committee.

The objective of this Standard is to establish requirements for a management system for sustainable development in communities, including cities, using a holistic approach, with a view to ensuring consistency with the sustainable development policy of communities.

The intended outcomes of a management system for sustainable development in communities include —

- (a) managing sustainability and fostering smartness and resilience in communities, while taking into account the territorial boundaries to which it applies;
- (b) improving the contribution of communities to sustainable development outcomes;
- (c) assessing the performance of communities in progressing towards sustainable development outcomes and the level of smartness and of resilience that they have achieved; and
- (d) fulfilling compliance obligations.

This Standard is intended to help communities become more resilient, smart and sustainable, through the implementation of strategies, programmes, projects, plans and services, and demonstrate and communicate their achievements.

This Standard is intended to be implemented by an organization designated by a community to establish the organizational framework and to provide the resources necessary to support the management of environmental, economic and social performance outcomes. A community that chooses to establish the organizational framework by itself is considered to constitute an organization as defined in this Standard.

This Standard is applicable to communities of all sizes, structures and types, in developed or developing countries, at local, regional or national levels, and in defined urban or rural areas, at their respective level of responsibility.

This Standard can be used in whole or in part to improve the management of sustainable development in communities. Claims of conformity to this Standard, however, are not acceptable unless all its requirements are incorporated into an organization's management system for sustainable development in communities and fulfilled without exclusion.

This Standard is identical with, and has been reproduced from, ISO 37101:2016, *Sustainable development in communities* — *Management system for sustainable development* — *Requirements with guidance for use.*

As this document has been reproduced from an International Standard the following applies:

- (i) In the source text "this International Standard" should read "this Australian Standard".
- (ii) A full point substitutes for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.

Australian or Australian/New Zealand Standards that are identical adoptions of international normative references may be used interchangeably. Refer to the online catalogue for information on specific Standards.

The terms "normative" and "informative" are used in Standards to define the application of the appendices or annexes to which they apply. A "normative" appendix or annex is an integral part of a Standard, whereas an "informative" appendix or annex is only for information and guidance.
