This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee ME/51, Amusement Rides and Devices, to supersede AS 3533 Supplement 1—1988, Logbook—Amusement rides and devices.

This Standard incorporates Amendment No. 1 (March 2001). The changes required by the Amendment(s) are indicated in the text by a marginal bar and amendment number against the clause, note, table, figure, or part thereof affected.

This Standard is the result of a consensus among Australian and New Zealand representatives on the Joint Committee to produce it as an Australian Standard.

The purpose of this logbook is to provide a succinct record of the important issues relating to the safety of an amusement ride or device and to indicate briefly where further information can be sought. The logbook should be read in conjunction with AS 3533.2. AS 3533.2 contains definitions and registration information applicable to the logbook, while also specifying requirements and providing guidance in every aspect of the operation and maintenance of amusement rides and devices.

Regulatory authorities may require, as a minimum, the information contained in this logbook to be kept for individual amusement rides and devices.

The term 'informative' has been used in this Standard to define the application of the appendix to which it applies. An 'informative' appendix is only for information and guidance.
