Preface

This Standard was prepared by the Australian members of the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee SF-041, Safety of Machinery.

The objective of this Standard is to specify the safety requirements for machine design, construction, installation, commissioning, operation, adjustment, maintenance and cleaning of pallet wrapping machines. This applies to the following groups of machines:

- (a) Pallet banding machines.
- (b) Stretch film pallet wrapping machines.
- (c) Stretch film hood application machines.
- (d) Mobile stretch film wrapping machines.
- (e) Semi-automatic self-driving stretch film wrapping machines.
- (f) Shrink film pallet wrapping machines.
- (g) Shrink film hood application machines.
- (h) Film removing machines.
- (i) Shrinking systems.
- (j) Sleeve wrapping machines for product greater than 400 mm in one direction.
- (k) Product centralising machines.

This Standard is identical with, and has been reproduced from, EN 415-6:2013, *Safety of packaging machines*, Part 6: *Pallet wrapping machines*.

As this document has been reproduced from an International Standard, the following applies:

- (i) In the source text 'this European Standard' should read 'this Australian Standard'.
