PREFACE

This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee IT-019, Information and Documentation to supersede AS/NZS 1519:1997, *Information and documentation—International standard book numbering (ISBN)*.

This Standard is identical with, and has been reproduced from ISO 2108:2005, *Information and documentation—International Standard Book Number (ISBN)*.

The objective of this Standard is to provide publishing communities with specification of the structure and administration of the 13 digit International Standard Book Number.

The terms ‘normative’ and ‘informative’ are used to define the application of the annex to which they apply. A normative annex is an integral part of a standard, whereas an informative annex is only for information and guidance.

As this Standard is reproduced from an international standard, the following applies:

- (a) Its number appears on the cover and title page while the international standard number appears only on the cover.
- (b) In the source text ‘this International Standard’ should read ‘this Australia/New Zealand Standard’.
- (c) A full point substitutes for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.

References to International Standards should be replaced by references to Australian or Australian/New Zealand Standards, as follows:
