PREFACE

This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee EL/2 on Electrical Approvals Standards, to supersede AS/NZS 3160:1993.

This Standard is one of a series of Approval and Test Specifications issued by Standards Australia and Standards New Zealand. These Standards are to be read in conjunction with AS 3100, *Approval and test specification—General requirements for electrical equipment.* The objective of these Standards is to outline the conditions which must be met to secure approval for the sale and use of electrical equipment. Only safety matters and related conditions are covered.

This Standard was revised to incorporate Amendment Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 to AS/NZS 3160:1993 and to effect changes to Clauses 18 and Appendix A for marking and normal operation tests.

Where there is a published Australian/New Zealand harmonized or Joint Standard referenced in this Standard, the relevant New Zealand Standard number is given in Clause 3 of this Standard.

This Standard supersedes AS/NZS 3160:1993 from date of publication.

This Standard does not provide all the necessary conditions for a contract.

The term 'normative' has been used in this Standard to define the application of the appendix to which it applies. A 'normative' appendix is an integral part of a Standard.

Users of Standards are reminded that copyright subsists in all Standards Australia and Standards New Zealand publications and software.
