PREFACE

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee IT-019, Computer Applications—Information and documentation. This Standard is identical with, and has been reproduced from ISO 8459-5:2002, Information and documentation—Bibliographic data element directory—Part 5: Data elements for the exchange of cataloguing and metadata.

The objective of this Standard is to provide the library community with the data elements required to facilitate the interchange of data between circulation systems in the information and documentation industries.

The terms 'normative' and 'informative' have been used in this Standard to define the application of the annex to which they apply. A 'normative' annex is an integral part of a Standard, whereas an 'informative' annex is only for information and guidance.

As this Standard is reproduced from an International Standard, the following applies:

- Its number does not appear on each page of text and its identity is shown only on the cover and title page.
- In the source text 'this part of ISO 8459' should read 'this Australian/New Zealand Standard'.
- A full point should be substituted for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.
