#### Foreword

This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee EL-002- Safety of Household and Similar Electrical Appliances and Small Power Transformers to supersede AS/NZS 60335.2.67:2002 three years from the date of publication. During this period it is anticipated that regulatory authorities will approve floor treatment machines, for commercial use to either standard.

This Standard incorporates Amendment No. 1 (November 2014) and applies to formatting of the IEC text in the "including IEC text" version only. The formatting changes are not indicated by a marginal bar.

The principal changes in this edition as compared with the third edition of IEC 60335-2-67 and its amendments are as follows (minor changes are not listed).

- the title has been changed for better distinction with regard to IEC 60335-2-72;
- the scope has been revised editorially to avoid misunderstandings;
- terms and definitions has been revised with regard to the requirements revised;
- the standard has been revised in general and updated regarding state-of-the-art, as far as necessary, in particular some changes have been made to Clauses 15, 22 and 25;
- a new Annex BB (LPG requirements) was added;
- a new Annex CC 'Emission of acoustical noise' was added; and
- a new Annex DD 'Emission of vibration' was added.

The objective of this Standard is to provide manufacturers, designers, regulatory authorities, testing laboratories and similar organizations with safety requirements designed to give the user protection against hazards that might occur during normal operation and abnormal operation of the appliance and which may be used as the basis for approval for sale or for connection to the electricity supply mains in Australia and New Zealand

The text of IEC 60335-2-67 Ed 4, prepared by IEC Technical Committee SC 61J, was submitted to the Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Combined Procedure (dual public comment and committee vote) for adoption of the IEC standard as a Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand joint standard.

This Standard is an adoption with national modifications of the fourth edition of IEC 60335-2-67, Household and similar electrical appliances – Safety – Part 2-67: Particular requirements for floor treatment machines, for commercial use. It has been varied as indicated to take account of Australian and New Zealand conditions.
