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## PREFACE

A1 | This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee BD-004, Masonry Structures, to supersede AS 4773.2—2010.

*This Standard incorporates Amendment No. 1 (September 2020). The changes required by the Amendment are indicated in the text by a marginal bar and amendment number against the clause, note, table, figure or part thereof affected.*

The objective of this Standard is to provide minimum requirements for use by builders for the construction of masonry in small buildings, such as houses and garages.

This Standard is intended as a companion document to AS 4773.1, *Masonry in small buildings*, Part 1: *Design*.

The objective of this revision is to provide clarifications and minor corrections.

Statements expressed in mandatory terms in notes to tables and figures are deemed to be requirements of this Standard.

The term ‘informative’ has been used in this Standard to define the application of the appendix to which it applies. An ‘informative’ appendix is only for information and guidance.

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
