RESPIRATORY PROTECTIVE DEVICES – NOMENCLATURE OF COMPONENTS

NSAI in exercise of the power conferred by section 16 (5) of the National Standards Authority of Ireland Act, 1996 (No. 28 of 1996) and with the consent of the Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, hereby declares as follows:

- 1. This instrument may be cited as the Standard Specification (Respiratory Protective Devices Nomenclature of Components) Declaration, 1998.
- 2. (1) The Specification set forth in the Schedule to this declaration is hereby declared to be the standard specification for Respiratory Protective Devices Nomenclature of Components. Schedule comprises the text of EN 134:1998.
- (2) The said standard specification may be cited as Irish Standard EN 134:1998 or as I.S. EN 134:1998.
- 3. (1) The Standard Specification (Respiratory Protective Devices Nomenclature of Components) Declaration, 1991 is hereby revoked.
- (2) Reference in any other standard specification to the Instrument hereby revoked and to Irish Standard/EN 134:1991 thereby prescribed, shall be construed, respectively, as references to this Instrument and to Irish Standard/EN 134:1998.
