EOLAS - The Irish Science and Technology Agency in exercise of the power conferred by section 20 (3) of the Industrial Research and Standards Act, 1961 (No. 20 of 1961) and the Science and Technology Act, 1987 (No. 30 of 1987), and with the consent of the Minister for Industry and Commerce, hereby declares as follows:

1. This instrument may be cited as the Standard Specification (Dentistry – Dental Zinc Polycarboxylate Cements) Declaration, 1991.

2. (1) The Specification set forth in the Schedule to this declaration is hereby declared to be the standard specification for Dentistry – Dental Zinc Polycarboxylate Cements. The Schedule comprises the text of EN 24104:1990.

(2) The said standard specification may be cited as Irish Standard/EN 24104 : 1991 or as I.S./EN 24104 : 1991.
