2. (1) The Specification set forth in the Schedule to this declaration is hereby declared to be the standard specification for EDI - Message - Forwarding and consolidation summary message (IFCSUM). The Schedule comprises the text of EN 1580 : 1995.

(2) The said standard specification may be cited as Irish Standard/EN 1580:1995 or as I.S./EN 1580:1995.
