Foreword

The text of the International Standard from Technical Committee ISO/TC 150 "Implants for surgery" of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) has been taken over as a European Standard by Technical Committee CEN/TC 285 "Non-active surgical implants", the secretariat of which is held by NEN.
