Introduction - Motivation for sign language in the web

Many deaf sign language users regard information in sign language to be much more conveniently perceivable to them than information given in written language. It is therefore motivated to complement text information in the Internet web with sign language stored in such a way that it is reproduced with good readability when replayed.

Provision of the contents of a web page in form of sign language can be a pre-requisite for some deaf sign language users to be able to congest the information.
