## **Foreword**

## FOREWORD

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards institutes (ISO Member Bodies). As part of this process, Technical Committee ISO/TC 61 has reviewed ISO Recommendation R 183 and found it technically suitable for transformation. International Standard ISO 183 therefore replaces ISO Recommendation R 183-1961 to which it is technically identical.
