Foreword

Introduction

The terms presented in this document have been selected as terms frequently used in the specific suite of existing standards produced by the Technical Committee CEN/TC38 'Durability of wood and wood-based products'.

The terms presented in the document corresponding to the aim of CEN/TC 38 are widely the terms included in BS 4261 with the kind authorisation of BSI.

Some terms and their definitions can differ from those preferred and designated in other European Standards or standards at a national level.

Terms are listed alphabetically in the trilingual index and are referred to by numbers, which are found against terms in the body of the vocabulary. There they are arranged in alphabetical order within each section.

Bold type in a definition denotes a term that is defined elsewhere in the vocabulary.
